## Name 1 task you usually do before attending a class.

#### Critical Tasks – Pre-class

- 1. **Ensure** no unclear concepts are carried forward.
- 2. **Read** the learning materials of the next lesson
- 3. Mark unclear concepts and new vocabularies
- 4. Search meaning of the new vocabularies
- 5. **Participate** in the pre-class activities, if any

#### Pre-class Tasks: Concept Clarification

No unclear concepts should be carried forward:

Go through the learning materials of the previous class.
 Check if there are still unclear concepts to be cleared.
 If yes, look up references or discuss with your peers e.g. study group..... etc.

 $\checkmark$  Approach your teacher if the concepts remain unclear.

#### Pre-class Tasks: Read & Grasp

Read and try to **grasp the main ideas** of the learning materials of the next lesson:

✓ Get the learning materials

e.g. PowerPoint slides, book chapter, reading materials, videos etc.

 You may explore further on the prescribed information by referring to other relevant resources

e.g. Online videos, electronic resources, supplementary readings, using keywords etc.

#### Pre-class Tasks: Mark new knowledge

Mark unclear concepts and new vocabularies:
 Use a highlight pen to mark the difficult concepts

 This enables you to refer to these difficult points easily while attending the class

 New vocabulary – this is a good opportunity to build your own glossary of this course.

✓ Develop an user friendly method to compile your glossary

#### Pre-class Tasks: Learn new words

Search meanings of the new vocabularies:
 Use a dictionary to check the meaning of the vocabulary

 Pay attention to the examples of applications included in the dictionary

 Suggest to use EXCEL to create a catalog of your glossary with explanation of the meaning, perhaps both in English and Chinese.

#### Critical Tasks – During class

- 1. Get the learning materials ready, in paper or in electronic format
- 2. Annotate the parts with unclear concepts in the learning materials
- 3. Prepare questions for concepts / ideas you do not understand.
- 4. **Participate** in classroom activities, if any

#### In-class Tasks: Get ready

Get the **learning materials ready**, in paper or in electronic format:

Download the learning materials, generally available through Moodle

 e.g. PowerPoint slides, readings, videos etc.
 Print a copy for easy annotation

 Remember to bring a copy to the class

 Can be electronic copy or printed copy

#### **In-class Tasks: Annotations**

Annotate your learning materials, especially new concepts identified earlier:

✓ Annotation, especially for new concepts

Listen carefully to the explanation

Try to extract the main points

Use your own words to record these main points

Can use symbols, abbreviations (and even Chinese if necessary!)

✓ Mark the vocabulary which you are not familiar.

#### **In-class Tasks: Prepare questions**

Prepare questions for ideas / concepts you do not understand:
Planning for questions to clarify ideas / concepts help you to identify
WHAT you know and WHAT you do not know
Develop the habit of preparing questions while listening to the lecture!

#### In-class Tasks: Class activities

Participate in classroom activities, if any:

Don't simply listen and attend passively
 Actively participate in the classroom discussions!

✓ Participation contributes to final assessment mark!

#### Critical Tasks – During class

- 1. Get the learning materials ready, in paper or in electronic format
- 2. Annotate the parts with unclear concepts in the learning materials

#### Critical Tasks – After class

- Review the PowerPoint slides, other teaching materials and your notes
- 2. **Revisit** the difficult concepts
- 3. **Summarize** the lecture content
- 4. Use tools to visualize the connection between concepts / ideas


#### Post-Class Tasks: Review & Revisit

Read through the slides, other teaching materials and your notes again


Make necessary changes with more concise and simple language

Symbol	Name	Function		
	Start/end	An oval represents a start or end point		
	Arrows	A line is a connector that shows relationships between the representative shapes		
	Input/Output	A parallelogram represents input or output		
	Process	A rectangle represents a process		
$\bigcirc$	Decision	A diamond indicates a decision
