

Eco-Culture Tour to Peng Chau

The Faculty of Science and Technology had organized an **Eco-Culture Tour to Peng Chau** on 17 January 2020.

A total of 31 AScES year 2 students joined this activity, which was led by Judy KIU.

As early as the Qing Dynasty Peng Chau was already an extremely prosperous **trade market**. Wing On Street, the main street in front of the Tin Hau Temple, has more than 200 years history. In its heyday, the daily street fair there would have shops and vendors of everything to satisfy the daily needs. The island could be self-sufficient in those days.

Students visited the old match-factory area to learn the **industrialization history** there.

Then, we went to Tai Lai Island to see the coastal ecology and found some marine lives and to learn the **marine pollution problems**. In the afternoon, students visited different temples to learn the **heritage conservation** issues. At last, we gathered at a beach facing the sea where “**Lantau Tomorrow**” work may take place there, and had a discussion over this Government proposed project.
